Our Land Acknowledgement

We recognize the land that Queen's University is situated on as the traditional unceded lands known as Katarokwi of the Anishinaabe. Following a forced relocation, this land has also been home to the Haudenosaunee Peoples.

We recognize the actions of the Canadian Government as an ongoing cultural genocide that has violently and forcibly assimilated and alienated Indigenous Peoples from their sovereignty. We also acknowledge and celebrate the resilience of Indigenous Peoples across so-called Canada, and the significance of this territory to the Peoples who call this land home, and whose practices and spiritualities are tied to the land and continue to develop in relationship to this territory and its other inhabitants.

We are grateful to live on, learn from, and enjoy this land, and commit ourselves to decolonization in our personal lives, our schools, and in our communities. The commitments to decolonization and Reconciliation which we make in this and any Land Acknowledgement must be actively pursued and carry the understanding that if Reconciliation is to be successful, we must deepen the ways that we listen to, learn from, and support Indigenous Peoples in their resistance, resilience, and self-determination.

We remind our non-Indigenous participants that it is your duty to work toward a relationship with Indigenous Peoples that fosters Reconciliation. We thank our Indigenous participants for sharing their knowledge and experiences with us and look forward to working with you.
